
Who Can Attend?

REFLECTIONS FROM THE NATIONAL AA TECHNOLOGY WORKSHOP



Hi! I'm Avi (they/them), I'm an alcoholic, and your Area Secretary.

Using technology has become a big part of my roles, both as the Area Secretary and as a member of Area 30's Technology Committee. I thought it would be helpful to connect with other AA's relating to technology use in service. Therefore, on September 8th-10th I virtually attended the 2023 National AA Technology Workshop.

Here are some things I learned about tech in AA at the conference:

- The Online Intergroup of Alcoholics Anonymous has been around since the mid 1990's long before the COVID-19 pandemic made it more broadly known.
- A lot of committees throughout the US are now using QR codes to get AAs connected to more resources, just like our Area 30 committees and local intergroups are!
- Some Areas use applications or programs that transcribe business and committee meetings minutes, to lessen the load on the secretaries and committee chairs.

Here are some things I've learned about attending AA conferences, both in person and virtually:

- I bring snacks and water in addition to my caffeine! You never know when you might get caught HALTy!
- I was advised before the first time I attended NERAASA (North East Regional AA Service Assembly) that I should miss a panel or two to rest and recharge. I, an introvert, was happy to be reminded that self care is essential to service work. Thanks service sponsor. ;-)
- I reach out to my sponsor and the rest of my support system throughout a conference, because while attending my life isn't magically on hold, and I'm still an alcoholic!
- Service sponsors are a great resource when questions arise.


