6. When someone turns up at AA needing information or help (even if he can't ask for it aloud),

does it really matter to me what he does for a lining? Where he lives? What his domestic arrangements are? Whether he has been to AA before? What his other problems are?

We have been around for over 31 years, with humble beginnings on Pearl Street. When coming to one of our meetings you will be welcomed by "Bobby in the Lobby" who sells raffle tickets. We are grateful because Bobby is there every day making coffee and providing comic relief. Also selling tickets is "Paul in the Hall" and "Mac in the Back". We get endless laughs calling their names during the introduction to the meeting. Raffle winners can choose from a choice of several books including the favorite "Alcoholics Anonymous." Several members know How it Works by heart and vie for the privilege to recite it as we do daily. Most days we have a core group of 40 members or so with long-time friends coming back regularly.

This is a fine place to find a sponsor. Come early and join the fun. Seriously.
