The Sixth Tradition

"An A.A. group ought never endorse, finance or lend the A.A. name to any related facility or outside enterprise, lest problems of money, property and prestige divert us from our primary purpose."

The "related facility" may be an outside group combating alcoholism—or an enterprise that A.A.'s want to start. It was the latter that most often confronted the young Fellowship. Outside agencies were pretty scarce in those days, and some members thought A.A. should cover the whole alcoholism field. Led by a "superpromoter" (as the "Twelve and Twelve" describes him), one group built an all-purpose center, including a section for drying-out treatment. Picture any group tackling such a project! Arguments over cost, architecture, staff, fees, medication, and rules might even make the local paper. (And pity the poor newcomer straying into the group— "We'll get around to you in a minute.")

Though that ambitious center failed, some individual members have since founded successful clubhouses, rest farms, halfway houses, etc. The enterprises are run by these A.A.'s and patronized by other members or prospective members. But money and property are involved. Therefore, it has proved wise to keep the operation of the facility completely separate from that of any A.A. group, and to keep "A.A." or terms like "Twelfth Step" out of the name.

Toward outside agencies dealing with alcoholism, the A.A. policy is "cooperation but not affiliation." A group cooperates, for example, by welcoming referrals from clinics or by sponsoring A.A. groups in institutions. But in one area, money for a rehab was solicited at an A.A. meeting—implying affiliation. In another, A.A. was listed among beneficiaries of a United Fund drive....

A.A. members employed by outside agencies "wear two hats"— but Tradition Six cautions any such members against wearing both at once! On the job, they may be alcoholism counselors; they are not "A.A. counselors." At meetings they're just A.A.'s, not alcoholism experts.

True Twelfth Step Work—HELP the HALTline!

What the HALTline is:

One alcoholic talking to another alcoholic --- Isn't that what A.A. is all about? You Might:

Give meeting time and location information.

Talk and/or listen to a sober alcoholic in danger of picking up a drink.

Talk and/or listen to a sober alcoholic who is visiting the area.

Talk to a "drunk". You may be the link in a chain that could save their life.

Refer callers to the Intergroup Office—inform them of the office hours.

What the HALTline is not:

The Halt Line is not a taxi service...
It is not a referral service...We are not a counseling service...
We do not give medical advice or opinions.

What you need to be a volunteer:

One year of sobriety is suggested because the first year needs focus on recovery before such service; Touch-tone phone service; Meeting lists (we suggest District 26 and Worcester Area). These are available free of charge from Worcester Area Intergroup and are available on the Website "www.aaworcester.org," and 3 or more hours of time during the week that you will be available to answer calls. You need not have to answer as A.A.—you can simply answer and when asked say you are "Answering for Worcester Area Intergroup, How can I help you?"

What will happen:

For your scheduled time, calls are forwarded from the Intergroup Office to the phone number you provide. This is done at no expense to you.

ATTENTION TO ALL WOMEN IN THE FELLOWSHIP:

We have received a request from The Willows Program at Spectrum in Westboro. This is the female
CSS unit of their program. Currently only 5 days of speaker commitments are covered for each
month. WE NEED WOMEN IN THE PROGRAM to pass the message of experience, strength and
hope to the women at Willows. They are not hearing much of anything at this point. Having only 5
commitments per month speak is too sporadic.

So we are looking for Women's Groups or better yet women with friends to take a once a month Standing Commitment to get the message to these patients!! The commitment is from 7:30-8:30pm. Get back to us early and you can have your pick of the dates as almost all of them are currently open.

ATTENTION TO OUR YOUNGER FELLOWSHIP MEMBERS:

We have received a request from the Motivating Youth Recovery (MYR) Program of CHL in
Worcester for Standing Commitments. This program has kids aged 12-17 years of age that already
have issues with substance abuse. This is an extremely important opportunity for the fellowship to
provide a message of a different way of life to these kids. Just maybe some younger members of
the fellowship can better connect with this audience.

And remember you don't have to wait around for the business meetings of your groups to get approval to take a standing commitment to these facilities or any other for that matter.
