When anyone, anywhere, reaches out for help, I want the hand of A.A. always to be there.

The Seventh Tradition

"Every A.A. group ought to be fully self-supporting, declining outside contributions."

We do have to be practical. A group can hardly hold its regular meetings on a street corner, and an empty basket won't fill a coffee urn. As soon as we become active in a group, we learn how many expenses are involved in making its meetings effective. Then our horizons broaden. What about that intergroup or central office so many of us called to ask for help? Phone companies don't give free service. Beyond our own locality, we learn about the A.A. General Service Office and the work it does for groups everywhere. A.A. activity is self-supporting at all levels, and in every case the responsibility comes right back to us, the individual members, for we are A.A. Perhaps, especially when we are very new, our contributions clink, rather than rustle. The first members were in the same fix, and it seemed to them that A.A. would need more outside help than the modest gifts then coming in. Their plans required grand-scale philanthropy. (Tradition Six hadn't evolved yet; Bill W. recalled a scheme for "a chain of hospitals.") But John D. Rockefeller Jr., an early friend said, "I am afraid that money will spoil this thing." A few A.A.'s had already reached the same conclusion; gradually, this minority became a majority as experience showed that mem-bers themselves could provide enough to finance A.A.'s proper aim. In its simplest application, Tradition Seven is easily understood; when we hear about a new A.A. group be-ing started with funds from a Federal antipoverty pro-gram, our quick reaction is "Somebody goofed!" But then we come to "borderline" cases: Groups put on a raffle for the benefit of their central office and invite the public to buy tickets; a hometown paper runs an ad for an A.A. dance and show. Both projects would be routine

for any other society. For us, both mean that we've got the hand out again, asking nonmembers for money.

Often, of course, we don't have to ask. A.A. is now high on the worthy-cause list; G.S.O. and groups politely turn down many unsolicited gifts and bequests. In Tradition Seven, there's a note of realism: Handsome gifts may have strings attached. We even put a limit of \$5,000 on the amount members may leave to A.A. in their wills or contribute annually while living, so that none of us can buy influence in A.A., no matter how rich we are.

Money may pose a different problem if a group treasury grows too fat, beyond a prudent reserve. Squabbling over uses for the spare cash, groups have lost their unity and strayed from their purpose. But there's one simple solution that strengthens our unity and advances our purpose: Give the excess to A.A. activities and services....

True Twelfth Step Work—HELP the HALTline!

What the HALTline is:

One alcoholic talking to another alcoholic --- Isn't that what A.A. is all about?

You Might:

Give meeting time and location information.

Talk and/or listen to a sober alcoholic in danger of picking up a drink.

Talk and/or listen to a sober alcoholic who is visiting the area.

Talk to a "drunk". You may be the link in a chain that could save their life.

Refer callers to the Intergroup Office—inform them of the office hours.

What the HALTline is not:

The Halt Line is not a taxi service...
It is not a referral service...We are not a counseling service...
We do not give medical advice or opinions.

What you need to be a volunteer:

One year of sobriety is suggested because the first year needs focus on recovery before such service; Touch-tone phone service; Meeting lists (we suggest District 26 and Worcester Area). These are available free of charge from Worcester Area Intergroup and are available on the Website "www.aaworcester.org," and 2 or more hours of time during the week that you will be available to answer calls. You need not have to answer as A.A.—you can simply answer and when asked say you are "Answering for Worcester Area Intergroup, How can I help you?"

What will happen:

For your scheduled time, calls are forwarded from the Intergroup Office to the phone number you provide. This is done at no expense to you.

ATTENTION TO ALL WOMEN IN THE FELLOWSHIP:

We have received a request from The Willows Program at Spectrum in Westboro. This is the female
CSS unit of their program. Currently only 5 days of speaker commitments are covered for each
month. WE NEED WOMEN IN THE PROGRAM to pass the message of experience, strength and
hope to the women at Willows. They are not hearing much of anything at this point. Having only 5
commitments per month speak is too sporadic.

So we are looking for Women's Groups or better yet women with friends to take a once a month Standing Commitment to get the message to these patients!! The commitment is from 7:30-8:30pm. Get back to us early and you can have your pick of the dates as almost all of them are currently open.

ATTENTION TO OUR YOUNGER FELLOWSHIP MEMBERS:

We have received a request from the Motivating Youth Recovery (MYR) Program of CHL in
Worcester for Standing Commitments. This program has kids aged 12-17 years of age that already
have issues with substance abuse. This is an extremely important opportunity for the fellowship to
provide a message of a different way of life to these kids. Just maybe some younger members of
the fellowship can better connect with this audience.
