### **Traditions Checklist**

These questions were originally published in the AA Grapevine in conjunction with a series on the Twelve Traditions that began in November 1969 and ran through October 1971. While they were originally intended primarily for individual use, many AA groups have since used them as a basis for wider discussion.

### TRADITIONS CHECKLIST:

- 1. Do I ever cop out by saying, "I'm not a group, so this or that Tradition doesn't apply to me"?
- 3. Am I willing to explain firmly to a newcomer the limitations of AA help, even if he gets mad at me for not giving him a loan?
- 5. Have I today imposed on any AA member for a special favor or consideration simply because I am a fellow alcoholic?
- 7. Am I willing to twelfth-step the next newcomer without regard to who or what is in it for me?
- 8.9. Do I help my group in every way I can to fulfill our primary purpose?10.
- 11. Do I remember that AA old-timers, too, can be alcoholics who still suffer?

  Do I try both to help them and to learn from them?
