NERAASA (North East Regional Alcoholics Anonymous Service Assembly)

I am grateful to Worcester Area Intergroup for supporting attendance at NERAASA. I was able to attend again this year and had a wonderful experience. NERAASA is like a giant pep rally for service work. I have met some wonderful people who have shared their experience strength and hope with me about service work.

How it all began for Me; I was just over a year sober and a member of the Upton Caper town meeting. John H. and Brandy H. were very active in the group and thought I should become the groups GSR (General Service Representative) not knowing what it was all about I started to ask around and heard things like OHHH don't get involved, it's a giant business meeting, It's all politics, they fight all the time at THOSE meetings, the list went on... needless to say, I attended the meeting to find out for myself. I was very confused and didn't know what was going on or even what Area 30 was (never mind District 25). I went 4 times and guit! (That's what I did back then rather than ask guestions) it was 2 ½ years later before I got involved again. I become the Alt. Intergroup Representative for my home group (Shrewsbury Gratitude) all that was required was for me to attend the meeting when the Intergroup Rep. couldn't make the meeting (easy enough). I started to attend the meetings, I knew many people from the different meetings that I attended so I felt comfortable enough to ask questions. Today when new delegates come to the meeting I try to make the effort to share my Experience, Strength & Hope, and encourage them to ask questions so they won't have to quit before giving it a try. We When I moved I had to find a new Home group. At the first Business meeting they were in need of an Alt. Intergroup Representative (Webster Triton) I volunteered. It was by attending the Delegates meeting and being involved that I knew in my heart this is where I needed and wanted to be. I love being a part of Alcoholics Anonymous as a whole! I found out for me, that A.A. was bigger than just the meetings I attended, where, I complain that I DO service work, setting up the hall, making the coffee, greeting people, selling tickets...isn't that enough? But A.A. needs our help! There is so much 12th step work that needs to be done behind the scenes to keep A.A. growing.

I have held many positions within the service structure of A.A. Alcathon Chair, Trustee on the Steering Committee, Treatment Facilities Chair, Chair of Intergroup, in the next few months I rotate into Trustee again. All of which I felt I was not qualified for but I learned as I went from those who came before me. During the past 5 years of Service work I have learned a lot about myself, and my defects. I am better able to just be another bozo on the bus rather than trying to force my ideas onto others (because you know, I'm always right!) I am honored to be the Current Intergroup Rep. to my newest Home group (Way of Sobriety) Now I know it's an honor and a responsibility to my group and to A.A. to do my part to carry the message and keep A.A. alive and thriving within our district.

I have been told we don't rotate out we rotate over. While sitting in as Trustee I'm already considering which position I will fill to help out. I know the God of my understanding will guide me in the right direction it won't be what I think is right that's for sure! But again I will grow and learn.
