Tradition Eight Checklist		
Is my own behavior accurately described by the Traditions? If not, what needs changing?	Do I try to sound in AA like an expert on alcoholism? On recovery? On medicine? On sociology? On AA itself? On psychology? On spiritual matters? Or, heaven help me, even on humility?	
When I chafe about any particular Tradition, do I realize how it affects others?	Do I make an effort to understand what AA employees do? What workers in other alcoholism agencies do? Can I distinguish clearly among them?	
Do I sometimes try to get some reward-even if not money-for my personal AA efforts?	In my own AA life, have I any experiences which illustrate the wisdom of this Tradition?
