Anonymity is the spiritual foundation of all our Traditions, ever reminding us to place principles before personalities.

From The Traditions Checklist:

- 1. Why is it a good idea for me to place the common welfare of all AA members before individual welfare? What would happen to me if AA as a whole disappeared?
- 2. When I do not trust AA's current servants, who do I wish had the authority to straighten them out?
- 3. In my opinions of and remarks about other AAs, am I implying membership requirements other than a desire to stay sober?
- 4. Do I ever try to get a certain AA group to conform to my standards, not its own?
- 5. Have I a personal responsibility in helping an AA group fulfill its primary purpose? What is my part?
- 6. Does my personal behavior reflect the Sixth Tradition or belie it?
- 7. Do I do all I can do to support AA financially? When is the last time I anonymously gave away a Grapevine sub-



scription?

- 8. Do I complain about certain AAs' behavior - especially if they are paid to work for AA? Who made me so smart?
- 9. Do I fulfill all AA responsibilities in such a way as to please privately even my own conscience? Really?
- 10. Do my utterances always reflect the Tenth Tradition, or do I give AA critics real ammunition?
- 11. Should I keep my AA membership a secret, or reveal it in private conversation when that may help another alcoholic (and therefore me)? Is my brand of AA so attractive that other drunks want it?
- 12. What is the real importance of me among more than a million AAs?



If I make it through, I will have 11 years of sobriety next February. That's nice to think about but I really only have today and I am ever so grateful for that.

If your Group would like to announce their Anniversary in The Beacon, please call the Intergroup Office during their normal business hours.



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Korte's Corner Returns....

I have been in Asheville, NC now for about ten days. The weather is beautiful here, and things are much different than in the great northeast. Some things, however, are just the same everywhere you go: Like my need to work with other alcoholics.

After about three hours in town, I realized I'd begun to lose the battle to not think about myself constantly. I was still a sick cat that needed to work with other drunks to stay sane himself.

Monday, Nov. 5th, my first full day here brought with it a waterfall of fears that I thought I had laid to rest. The freedom from many fears without an airtight connection with God was only an illusion that the comfort and familiarity of Boston had given me.

I was constantly assured by family, friends and sponsees (by their responses to me), that indeed, I had become well. Feelings of comfort from walking into a meeting and knowing many people there, or speaking at meetings and having folks walk up and tell me how good it was to hear me- these human supports I had been relying on more than I'd like to admit.

Whilst I touted God as the author of my recovery, I had relied on a seemingly endless supply of human assurance, unwittingly using my intellect as insurance for the miracle. Well, all that seemed to vanish on Sunday, November 4th, as I pulled into the driveway of 49 Maxwell St, Asheville, NC.

Monday morning, doubt flooded my mind. Questions raised up that I only thought I had answered. The most obvious of which was, "What the hell was I thinking?"

Hadn't I prayed ceaselessly for the next right thing to do? Hadn't I always wanted to live in another state? Even though I was happier than I ever had been before, hadn't I felt like there was a strong vibe pulling me here for only God knows what reason? Hadn't I come out of countless meditations feeling like this would be the perfect place for me to try a living in a new area and be useful in the A.A. program as well?

On Monday, November 5th, none of those things was clear to me. What *was* clear was the absence of all the visible insurance, all the safety, acceptance and human/material

proof of my wellness. I was really going to have to back up my talk about faith in God, and how He really is the source of my wellbeing.

Geez-it all *sounded* real coming out of my mouth all those years. I honestly believed God raised me here from the pile of rubble I had become. I truly felt guided by Him, why was it so hard to give up the visual and emotional crutches I had gotten used to?

I guess the truth is that while I was cruising comfortably, even doing a little trick riding along the way, I had really taken the training wheels off.

Once in Asheville, I craved the old support, the old rallying cries that I was one healthy dude. I hung on affirming emails like a sixteen-year-old girl waiting for her prom date to show up. As the days passed, I found myself pausing and asking God to remove fear and direct me, more and more often. I found old fears resurrected and making noise like the good old days of panic and frantic worry. As the fears grew, I noticed that they were getting further and further into the future, deeper into self, and frankly, more ridiculous.

They started with the basics, as they always seem to.

Fear of not having control: They weren't running the local step study meeting correctly. It was obviously going to be my job to right the ship, according to the deductions of my alcoholic mind. I wrestled with that one for about a day, playing over and over in my head all the things I would say and to which people.

I tried to turn it over to God, but kept reclaiming control of the issue, because I was *right*.

When I hang on to a fear, (voluntarily or involuntarily) it usually grows into about a zillion fears at light speed. From the fear of not having control, grew people's opinions, sprouted confrontation. From there it was only a hop, skip and a jump to mantras like, "no woman in her right mind is ever going to want anything to do with me" and "you loser...you're thirty-five and every job you take is a step down the economic ladder".

At this point, I'm nowhere near reality. I'm in self-centered fear like it's a vice grip. I prayed and prayed some more. I took my best shot at the "next right thing". But, above all, I realized how desperately I needed someone to work with. I had learned a while back that my real purpose in this life was to be a fisher of men. For me this is

vital, I needed these men more than they needed me. Combing through the meeting list book, I plotted my course.

Chuns Cove Group-no, I had been there-the people were a little too healthy looking, conversations seemed to revolve around the weather. The Traditional Group, no...12 & 12...no, then...BINGO! There it was! The ABCCM shelter meeting- perfect! The place was packed with guys donning their cleanest dirty T-shirt and people that couldn't sit still five minutes-I knew I was home.

I picked up my first new sponsee. Being as self-focused as I am, I knew the work to overcome self had just begun. Perusing the next day's agenda, I again skimmed the listings, deciding on a meeting at the Neil Dobbins Detox center-"just right" I thought. I was able to give my number to a wonderful fellow that was very grateful to be there-and alive. He had gotten there via the hospital where he was taken after laying down in the highway, hoping to be hit by a speeding vehicle. The man was instead picked up by some teenagers that took him to a hospital. This guy was obviously earmarked for me.

You know what? One more thing dawned on me. It's enough that I prayed about coming here and made the decision. It's probably none of my business why I'm here, maybe it's as simple as a lesson on trusting and relying on God. One thing's for sure-His timing is impeccable, these guys arrived just in time to save my butt.
