Keeping it simple - 24 Hours at a time

In the moments of any given day, emotions can be up, down, sideways, or indescribable. When things are good and all the cosmic tumblers seemed to be aligned, when I can do no wrong in anything I attempt to do, I sometimes become less than comfortable. When the pooh hits the fan, I know exactly what to do. *Call my sponsor, get to a meeting, pick up the phone, open up to another alcoholic, and do it quickly.* A problem talked about openly and honestly, can be cut in half in a short time. Issues held inside, and buried, fester forever, until they're dealt with. Denial is the fertilizer by which my troubles can grow.

But, in those moments of good, I can handle things poorly. I may come on too strong. I may bask in my own genius. I may become less humble. I may no longer remain *right sized*. These are the moments we work for in our sobriety. When the World finally stops coming to an end, when all the woes of my life dissipate and become solved. When all is right, and the good feeling inside warms us up, and tells us the effort was worth it. Going to meetings after meetings after meetings has finally paid off. It's in these good times I need to be the most right sized. The most humble. I need to understand that it may be fleeting, and accept (and enjoy) the payoff.

Sometimes 24 hours is too large of a time slice for me to live in. 60 minutes works better sometimes, and even in times of critical mass, when negative life seems to be closing in, 60 seconds is even more manageable for me.

As I was taught, in good times or bad, accept where you're at, learn from the experience, and pass it on as soon as you can. Try not to victimize people in your life when you're down, up, sideways, or in some other funk.

Acceptance is one of the keys to keeping it simple.
