Korte's Korner	
	I was having a discussion with an alcoholic friend that shares the same spiritual path with me this week about what it means to live a spiritual life and what it means to do God's will. I have often been confused as to what this should look like in my own life. I sometimes have narrow, limited ideas about the spiritual life. In spite of actually having a vision that showed me the meaning of the 3 <sup>rd</sup> step and God's will for me as contrary to my own restrictive notions.
	I occasionally fancy myself some sort of a drunk-turned-evangelistthen nausea kicks in and I have to abandon the idea. Once in a while, I'll picture myself doing some sort of work with "troubled" kids, which I have done, enjoyed, yet discovered wasn't for me. I imagine I should be teaching someone somewhere about alcoholism, using the knowledge I was given to enlighten others, most likely others that aren't interested in being " <i>enlightened</i> ".
	I frequently fall to asking myself questions like: Am I doing <i>enough</i> ? What should I <i>really</i> be doing with the gifts God has given me? Why am I still so afraid of failure sometimes, or that I'm not "recovered enough", or "doing this right". Is this because I don't meditate well (and have put in little or no effort to improve in the area)?
	Often, I start to convince myself there is some benchmark God wants me to achieve, some particular career or position He has me ear-marked for that I keep passing on out of ignorance or lack of effort. I then assume God will be annoyed with me for blowing up His plan again and again, as if I had the power to accomplish that.
ONLINE Worcester Area Intergroup	For reasons that escape me, I started telling my alcoholic chum about another friend I'll call Billy. The anniversary of Bill's death is this week. Billy fought in World War II, but he neve told me any war stories. I was a teenager, so I was always hungry for a daring story of explosions and escapes, or at least a drunken adventure, but I'd get none from Billy.

In a small town where scuttle-butt is nothing new, I could not remember ever hearing a rumor about the man, or a harsh word. I had talked to Bill hundreds of times, but I couldn't recall him saying anything negative about anyone. Oh, he joked a lot, in fact, he was known for having a million puns- all of them bad, but I can't recall him getting a laugh at someone else's expense. I do, however vaguely remember him gently looking at situations from different points of view a few times when I was character-assassinating them.
	Bill was referred to as the Mayor of Whitinsville for years, probably because he knew everyone in town, and always made time to stop and say a kind word. He was a great one for throwing a tennis ball at you one minute yelling, "think quick!", and leaving you chuckling the next. Bill made a habit out of taking the bus to visit people at St. Vincent's Hospital that he didn't know. One day I asked him about this, saying "Do you mean to tell me you don't even <i>know</i> these people, why would you do that?" Bill replied matter-of-factly, "well they don't have anyone to visit them" as though he were stating something obvious.
	Many times I finished my breakfast at the local diner and upon trying to pay, found that Billy had picked up my check on his way out. I found out some more neat things about Billy at his funeral. It seems he had picked up a habit of going to all the funerals in town and quietly praying in the back of the church, giving the father a spirited salute each time he saw him (the father gave Bill one last salute from the podium). I didn't know that Bill ever went to church. As people milled around having coffee after the funeral, I heard story after story of the little things this man had done, so often thinking of others and so seldom of himself. It was truly amazing. I thought I knew Billy pretty well, but the stories kept coming and coming.
	As I went on and on about Bill and all the crazy funny stuff he used to do and say, my alcoholic friend says"wownow <i>that</i> guy lived a spiritual life."

It hit me like a brick on the face, how had I missed it? I almost responded, "but he never even talked about God...he was just himself, he didn't do anything special!"

Then I thought of all the drunks Bill bought lunch for, all the people he made smile, all the times he had a kind word for someone that desperately needed one. The way he respected people that didn't even respect themselves. I remember being depressed when I heard Bill had cancer. I saw him walking up Main St with a sweater on in the middle of July, and thought I'd cheer him up with a little pity and compassion. I asked how he was doing, expecting to field a few dozen complaints, and he responded, "I can't complain!" with a spring in his voice that baffled me. I was trying to lift his spirits, and he lifted mine.

He wasn't Bill the preacher or Bill the devout, he was just Billy, living a simple life, setting simple examples that it only took a spiritual giant like me twenty years or so to understand.

Bill didn't have time to talk about the spiritual life, he was too busy living one.
