The Tenth Tradition

"Alcoholics Anonymous has no opinion on outside issues; hence the A.A. name ought never be drawn into public controversy."

1. Do I ever give the impression that there really is an "AA opinion" on Antabuse? Tranquilizers? Doctors? Psychiatrists? Churches? Hospitals? Jails? Alcohol? The federal or state government? Legalizing marijuana? Vitamins? Al-Anon? Alateen?
2. Can I honestly share my own personal experience concerning any of those without giving the impression I am stating the "AA opinion"?
3. What in AA history gave rise to our Tenth Tradition?
4. Have I had a similar experience in my own AA life?
5. What would AA be without this Tradition? Where would I be?
6. Do I breach this or any of its supporting Traditions in subtle, perhaps unconscious, ways?
7. How can I manifest the spirit of this Tradition in my personal life outside AA? Inside AA?

WAI INTERGROUP OFFICE PARKING NOTICE

The parking lot for the WAI offices is on the side of building and requires an access code —or action by office staff—to open the gate allowing entry. Call the office at the entry gate kiosk and office personnel will remotely open the gate for you.

If the office does not answer, please try again in a few seconds as office staff may be on the phone and unable to immediately acknowledge your call, and also confirm that your visit is during open office hours. No code is required to exit the lot. *The parking lot in the rear of the building is now for employees only and requires a badge for entry.*

The lot is private parking only and is not for Intergroup visitors.

WAI office personnel **CANNOT** validate a parking ticket for that lot. The lot attendant **WILL charge you \$15** to exit the lot without a validated ticket!

There are far too many people in very early sobriety at Treatment Facilities that are not hearing the message that we are responsible for carrying. With that said the WAI Treatment Facilities Committee is asking for your help.

There you will find calendars by facility to view open dates that we need your help filling. If the date says FILLED, it is currently covered. If the day of the month OPEN DATE it is available. Once you find a date that you can help fill please contact us at Treatment@aaworcester.org.

We have attached the month of October's open dates for several facilities. There are hundreds of open spots for the facilities we are working with. We need help and you can provide that for us in the following ways:

- 1) Having your Group take a Standing Commitment
- 2) Having a group of friends take a Standing Commitment
- 3) Having you and some friends fill an open spot until a Standing Commitment can be found

It is important that you contact us before taking an open date and not just show up for the commitment. We want to avoid double booking and also give the facility contacts a heads up that a group is planning to be there.
