However, the pace of change demands a more frequent and relevant communications platform than a monthly publication can offer. Thus, we are launching the *Beacon Weekly*, a digital-only newsletter which we hope will provide Worcester area A.A.'s with updates on where and how to access new and evolving recovery resources—both online as well as in person. We will continue to publish the Monthly Beacon issue (and its Intergroup reference information) as part of the *Weekly*'s month end issue.

VIRTUAL LOCAL MEETING SUPPORT FROM WAI

Fast, easy access to a detailed list of local Online A.A. meetings

Providing local A.A.'s with a up-to-date printed list of local A.A. meetings has been a service that Worcester Intergroup has been performing for many years. Now, just when we need it, Worcester Area Intergroup's home page includes the Virtual Meeting box and a link [https://bit.ly/2WIpfBD] to a spreadsheet listing Virtual A.A. meetings in the Massachusetts area, including many on the Worcester region (shown in green). Meetings are listed by name, day and time, topic/meeting topic, and links and passwords are given where required.

The spreadsheet can be downloaded or printed—**BE CAREFUL**—**THE LIST IS 188 PAGES** - so print only the pages that you need, or save as a PDF. The list is updated frequently so if you don't see a meeting listed near you, keep checking!

Got a new meeting to add? See the link in the Virtual Meeting box to go the Virtual Meeting Request Form page, and follow the process to submit a new meeting.

One element in online meetings which *is* different is that the digital world needs a special method to *'Pass the (Virtual) Basket'* for the Seventh Tradition. Online hosting and activity (such as Zoom meetings) cost money to operate, and area A.A. activities still need support to provide ongoing services, so a link to a contribution page is included [<u>http://aaworcester.org/contribution_page.html</u>]. Please help keep local A.A. resources available for the alcoholic who still suffers. The contribution page offers either PayPal or Square Cash payment methods.

A.A. Groups Using Digital Platforms to Find Sobriety During Coronavirus (COVID-19) Outbreak

Virtual Meetings, Email, Phone, Social Media Allow Message of Recovery to Carry On – "ONE DAY AT A TIME"

Statement from the A.A. General Service Office in New York City

The General Service Office (G.S.O.) of Alcoholics Anonymous for the U.S./Canada functions as a repository for A.A. members and groups who are looking for shared experience from the A.A. Fellowship. As the global situation related to Coronavirus (COVID-19) continues to develop, G.S.O. is fully committed to its role as an important resource center to help navigate this unprecedented public health emergency.

It is important to note, G.S.O. is not an authoritative body over A.A. groups, nor does it initiate rules or directives, as each A.A. group and entity is autonomous and decisions are made through an individual group conscience. Providing guidance on health issues is outside the scope of the A.A. sharing that G.S.O. offers. For anyone experiencing health and safety questions, it is suggested they contact national, state/provincial and local health authorities for appropriate information.

However, in response to the global outbreak, the office does have some general experience regarding how some A.A. groups and members have begun addressing this issue. Many are following "social distancing" guidelines established by local, state/provincial and federal officials, while at the same time maintaining their focus on recovery and facilitating digital A.A. meetings.

By attending digital meetings, group members can focus on A.A.'s primary purpose: to carry its message of recovery to the alcoholic who still suffers. Many groups have alerted local A.A. offices or hotlines if they are temporarily not meeting in their regular physical space. Some groups have shared that they are utilizing digital platforms such as Zoom, Google Hangouts, or conducting conference calls.

A.A. groups and members are also creating contact lists, keeping in touch by phone, email or social media. Many local A.A. central/intergroup offices and area service structures have added information to their websites about how to change a meeting format from "in-person" to a digital platform.

A.A. in the digital age has certainly taken on a new meaning in these challenging times, reminding its members and those searching for help that A.A. is not just a "place," but exists in the hearts, minds and help offered.

Statement from the A.A. General Service Office in New York City

As a result of Coronavirus (COVID-19), New York State has shut down 100% of operations of "nonessential" businesses/organizations. The General Service Office of Alcoholics Anonymous World Services, Inc. located at 475 Riverside Drive, New York, NY is closed, effective March 20, 2020, until further notice.

A.A.W.S. and A.A. Grapevine staff are "teleworking" until further notice as we continue our commitment to serving the A.A. Fellowship. Although we are available to support our membership and groups, these circumstances limit our abilities to be as effective as we would like. We ask that you please limit any communication with G.S.O. to email or aa.org.

We also have limited ability to access and process regular mail. Once again, it would be helpful, if possible, to email your correspondence. If you are a member and are considering sending a contribution, doing so online would be most helpful. <u>Make a contribution</u>. Thank you for your patience as we all work through these difficult challenges.

The Online Intergroup aids its member groups in their common purpose of carrying the AA message to the alcoholic who still suffers.

This directory includes well over 100 different Groups (we lost count!)—each group hosting from 1 to more than a dozen scheduled 'meetings.' Each group listed displays how to connect or enter the group, the time(s) of the meetings (in local or Daylight Savings time), a brief description of the format style of the meeting, and URLs/telephone numbers or other relevant access info.

Besides English, the list includes meetings offered in 12 other languages, and, meetings hosted in the U.S., Canada, and many other countries.
