



Public Information report for 7/23 The outreach to the schools to bring in literature is taking off. Biggest problem we face is enough help. We are looking for tAA's who are willing to get involved to carry the AA message. This is what we do.

Introduction What is Public Information work and Why Should A.A.s Do It?

Public Information (P.I.) in Alcoholics Anonymous means carrying the message of recovery to the still-suffering alcoholic by informing the general public about the A.A. program. We carry the message by getting in touch with and responding to the media, schools, industry, and other organizations which can report on the nature and purpose of A.A. and what it can do for alcoholics. This workbook will guide you through the Public Information process. The pages that follow suggest ways individuals can organize and perform P.I. work, as well as activities that have been successful for local P.I. committees. Those undertaking P.I. work for the first time, whether it be at the area, district, group, or intergroup/central office level, are encouraged to read and take guidance from the information contained here. It is suggested that members taking part in P.I. work should have several years of continuous sobriety. The first Public Information committee in A.A. was formed by the General Service Board in 1956. At that time, the following statement of "A.A.'s movement-wide public information policy" was written and approved by the General Service Conference.

The PI workbook is a simple read, nothing like the service manual. Very informative and keeps every one the same page. AA.org Public information workbook PDF Suggested requirements: Several years of good sobriety, working knowledge of 12 steps and 12

traditions.


