Treasurer's Report: (Jim B.) Total Income for September \$7306.49, Cost of Goods Sold \$3360.81, for a Gross Profit of \$3945.68. Office Expenses were \$3212.03 and Committee Expenses were \$121.99 for Total Monthly Expenses of \$3334.02. Checking Balance \$12645.10, Debit Account Balance \$659.55, Petty Cash \$150.00. Committee Remaining Budget Balance \$9721.83. Available Funds \$13454.65 minus Prudent Reserve \$8000.00 for Net Available Funds of \$5454.65. Report accepted.
